Thank you to all who were able to join us for the Martin Luther King Jr. performance this past month. Students did a wonderful job of presenting some lovely sounding and thought provoking music.


With the recent cold weather, we have seen an influx of students coming to school with chemical handwarmers. Please **do NOT** send students to school with chemical



handwarmers. The information from the manufacturers on these devices are that they can reach temperatures of 165 degrees and need proper supervision. That is sufficient indication of a safety concern for us to not let students use them here at school. In addition, there is not a genuine *need* for them in our environment. For example, a temperature of 15 degrees Fahrenheit and a wind speed of 20 mph creates a wind chill temperature of -2 degrees Fahrenheit. Under these conditions, which are very rare around here, it would take more than 30 minutes for frost bite to occur. A simple pair of mittens provides ample and much safer protection from the cold.

Do you know of any children in our attendance area who will be starting kindergarten next fall? If so, please pass along encouragement to their parents to be sure to watch for the opening of registration and be sure to come in as soon as possible to start the process. We can best prepare for the correct number of classrooms, teachers, books, desks, and other supplies for our new Pearson PRIDE students when we know how many will be joining us this fall.

Kindergarten Registration March 6 through March 10th 9:45 AM-3:00 PM Evening Registration Tuesday, March 7th 5-7 PM



As we begin looking forward to next school year, it is time to think about kindergarten registration. If you have a child who will be five on or before August 31, 2017, he/she is eligible to register for the 2017-2018 school year.

Kindergarten registration week will be March 6th through March 10th Registration hours will be 9:45 AM–3:00 PM. There will also be an evening registration Tuesday, March 7th from 5-7 PM.

FAQs

Where do I go to register my student?

- You can pre-register online at www.nkschools.org. In "Quick Links" click on Enrolling Students. Pre-registration is available online so you can get started from the comfort of your home. In order to complete the pre-registration, please make sure that you are at a computer with a printer, as there will be documents you need to print and bring to school to complete your registration.
- Or you can register at the Pearson Elementary Main Office.

What do I need to bring in to the school office if I pre-register my student online?

- Proof of address, if not able to upload during pre-registration.
- A copy of your child's Birth Certificate, if not able to upload during pre-registration.
- Immunization Dates Remember <u>all</u> students entering kindergarten must have current DTP, Polio, MMR series, Varicella (chicken pox), and Hepatitis B series.
- Printed and signed Health Emergency Form.

What do I need to bring to register my student at school? Please bring the following:

- Proof of address
- A copy of your child's Birth Certificate
- Immunization Dates Remember <u>all</u> students entering kindergarten must have current DTP, Polio, MMR series, Varicella (chicken pox), and Hepatitis B series prior to the first day of school
- Name and Phone Number of two local emergency contacts.

How long is the paperwork process? Approximately 30-45 minutes.

Can I bring the paperwork home and return it later? Yes, but we would like to have it returned by 3:00 PM on Friday, March 10th.

Can I bring my child with me? Yes, but you might want to bring an activity for your child to do while you fill out the paperwork.

Who will be teaching? At this time we are not sure who will be teaching as we need to see enrollment before the teacher placement is determined.

What classes will be offered? North Kitsap School District will provide free full-day Kindergarten at all of its elementary schools.

What about student supplies? The Pearson supply list will be on our website by mid June. The NKSD website is www.nkschools.org. Select schools and then select Pearson. On the Pearson web page in Quick Links you will find a supply list Icon.
